I. EUROPEAN UNION LAW & LATINAMERICAN INTEGRATION:

Créditos: 4 ECTS

Description: This course adopts a multidisciplinary approach to study European and Latin-American regional integration from the beginnings to the current situation and future challenges. This with a predominantly legal and institutional emphasis but including also political, historical, and economical perspectives to comprehensibly understand this matter. On the other hand, this course proposes to study these processes of regional integration through a comparative approach, with regards to the objectives of its creation, institutions, and common policies.



II. LAW, STATE & SOCIETY IN LATIN AMERICAN HISTORY

Créditos: 4 ECTS

Profesora: Marianne González Le Saux

Horario: Lunes 15:50-16:50 y miércoles 12:30-13:30

Description: This course introduces students to the main processes that have shaped Latin American states and legal systems from the colonial period to the 1990s. It will provide a general survey of the main developments of the history of Latin America, in relation to the process of state-building and the formation of Latin American legal culture.

The course adopts a social and cultural approach to the study of legal history. This means that legal institutions will be understood in their relationship to social structures and cultural constructs. Particular emphasis will be given to the agency of subaltern groups (such as indigenous people, slaves, women, peasants, and workers) in their interaction with the state and the legal system. The course adopts a broad regional perspective, with specific case studies according to the topics from Argentina, Brazil, Chile, Cuba, Colombia, Mexico, and Peru.
